Fairbanks Carpentry:

October 8th - October 12th; 8:00am—5:00pm

This 40-hour introductory training covers: The basic of carpentry, safety awareness, trades math, reading & using a tape measure efficiently. Proper & safe use of power tools, building layout using the 3-4-5 method. Use Pythagorean theorem, ratio & proportion and compound cut.

Anchorage Telecommunications:

October 15th - October 19th; 8:00am—5:00pm

This 40 hour introductory training covers; Exposure to basic principles in the telecommunications industry including; Central office operations, outside plant line and splicing work, installation and repair, data and key/pbx. Simple termination and testing of category 5E cabling, network interface device installation techniques, and block terminations will be parts of the labs done. Basic AC/DC theory as it relates to telecommunications will be explained as well as principles of light and fiber optics.

Anchorage Carpentry:

October 29th - November 2nd; 8:00am—5:00pm

This 40-hour introductory training covers the basics of carpentry, safety awareness, trades math, accurately using and reading a tape measure, proper and safe use of power tools, and building layout using the 3-4-5 method. Applying trades math to make compound cuts with a Skilsaw to build a sawhorse and stairs.

Anchorage Ironwork & Welding:

November 5th - November 9th; 8:00am—5:00pm

Training covers the basics of rebar, steel erection and welding used in the Ironworker Trade. Stick welding (SMAW) and oxy acetylene cutting will be covered.
